The ancient "O Antiphons" have been used by Christians for the last 1300 years. They focus our prayer on Old Testament prophecies of Christ. Traditionally sung before and after the Magnificat at Evening Prayer on the days leading up to Christmas, the choir will sing them over the Sundays in Advent at the 10:30 service of Choral Communion.

Bible Study on the Book of Psalms:

Tuesdays at 7pm, October and November

The Psalms are, of course, an integral and vital part of our liturgy, and many of us feel a deeply personal connection to individual psalms. At the same time, the Psalms as a whole and individually will repay more intentional study and shared reflection. The Psalms are traditionally divided into five Books; we will use this grouping, but subdivide Book Five into two groups. Each week a different parishioner will lead the discussion, with each taking their own approach and focusing on two or three of the Psalms in that group for further discussion and reflection. Our shared aim will be to deepen our spiritual understanding.

Return of the Common Chalice

During the early stages of the COVID-19 pandemic the administration of the Chalice at the Holy Communion was restricted by many churches throughout the world. With no evidence that it has ever been a cause for spreading illness, including during the current pandemic, it has returned in many places in Canada, the United States, and throughout the world, including in many dense urban areas. This has been noticed by many of us who have traveled recently. After consulting with Bishop Sandra, and at the request of Parish Council, the Rector and Wardens submitted a plan to the bishop to restore the Common Chalice at St George's. We are very grateful to her for granting us permission to resume the practice on the Feast of All Saints', last Tuesday, November 1st. Please be assured that no one wanting to partake in the Holy Communion is required to receive the Chalice. The full grace of the Sacrament is assured in receiving the Bread or the Wine alone. If you do not wish to receive the Chalice at the altar rail, please cross your arms over your chest after you have received the Bread. If you have any questions, please speak with Fr Hatt.

Advent Quiet Day - December 3rd

Practical Mysticism, Advent and Unconquerable Hope: Love and the Prayer Book way of life

The Rev'd Dr.Gary Thorne will guide our meditations this year. The three talks will begin at 9:45 a.m., 10:30 a.m. and 11:15 a.m. After Noonday Prayer a soup lunch will be served in the Hall.

Fr. Thorne writes:

We shall begin at 9AM with Morning Prayer and Holy Communion in the Round Church, followed by a series of talks and periods for quiet reflection until noon.

Throughout the morning I shall gently introduce us to Evelyn Underhill (1875-1941). She was an amazing woman who introduced countless clergy and ordinary pew-sitting Anglicans to the rich spiritual life of the Prayer Book Tradition. Her study of the Christian mystics led her to be the first woman to lecture in theology at Oxford University, and to write a book on Mysticism that remained as the authoritative classic for more than fifty years. But she is most well-known for her simple retreat addresses to the unlearned and non-devout Anglican, making our Prayer Book liturgical tradition 'come alive' in refreshing and illuminating ways.

Sunday School St. Nicholas Day Celebration Sunday, December 4

The Sunday School will be celebrating St. Nicholas Day on Sunday, December 4. There will be cookie decorating and activities in the Sunday School Room and, if we're very lucky, there might be a special visitor joining us after the 10:30am service of Choral Holy Communion.

Advent Lessons & Carols – December 4th at 5pm

The Parish Choir sings Advent Lessons and Carols next Sunday, December 4th at 5 p.m. in the Round Church. Music for the service will include Giovanni Pierluigi da Palestrina's *Matin Responsory* and also his *Vesper Responsory*, the motet *Vigilate* by William Byrd and Michael Praetorius' *Nun komm der heiden Heiland*. In addition, motets and anthems by Bennett, Bruckner, and Jan Pieterszoon Sweelinck will be featured. Traditional hymns of the season, including *Come thou Redeemer of the earth* (Puer nobis nascitur), *Wake, O Wake! with tidings thrilling* (Wachet auf) and *O Come, O Come Emmanuel* (Veni Emmanuel) will be sung by all. The closing Organ Voluntary will be *Nun komm der Heiden Heiland* by J.S. Bach. A freewill offering will be collected in support of St. George's Christmas Family Outreach.
