#### Introit

The "O" Antiphons

The ancient "O Antiphons" have been used by Christians for the last 1300 years. They focus our prayer on Old Testament prophecies of Christ. Traditionally sung before and after the Magnificat at Evening Prayer on the days leading up to Christmas, the choir will sing them over the Sundays in Advent at the 10:30 service of Choral Communion.

# **Tomorrow - Anniversary of the Halifax Explosion**

Monday, December 6th is the 104th anniversary of the Halifax Explosion, when the SS Mont-Blanc, a French cargo ship laden with high explosives, collided with the Norwegian vessel SS Imo in Halifax Harbour, during the height of World War I. That morning, 2,000 people were killed, and a further 9,000 injured. Along with other area churches and city hall, the bell at St George's will ring for one minute tomorrow morning, beginning at 9:04:35 a.m. to recall the exact moment the explosion occurred and to put us in mind of the cost and devastation caused by war.

# **TODAY at 5pm - Advent Lessons and Carols**

The Parish Choir sings Advent Lessons and Carols TODAY, December 5th at 5 p.m. in the Round Church. Music for the service will include Giovanni Pierluigi da Palestrina's Matin Responsory and also his Vesper Responsory, the motet Vigilate by William Byrd and Michael Praetorius, Nun komm der heiden Heiland. In addition, motets and anthems by Bennett, Bruckner, and Jan Pieterszoon Sweelinck will be featured. Traditional hymns of the season, including Come thou Redeemer of the earth (Puer nobis nascitur), Wake, O Wake! with tidings thrilling (Wachet auf) and O Come, O Come Emmanuel (Veni Emmanuel) will be sung by all.
