O Clavis David (O Key of David)

O Key of David, and Sceptre of the house of Israel; that openest and no man shutteth: and shuttest, and no man openeth: Come and bring the prisoner out of the prison house, and him that sitteth in darkness, and the shadow of death.

The ancient "O Antiphons" have been used by Christians for the last 1300 years. They focus our prayer on Old Testament prophecies of Christ. Traditionally sung before and after the Magnificat at Evening Prayer on the days leading up to Christmas, the choir will sing them over the Sundays in Advent at the 10:30 service of Choral Communion.


Financial Update

Total Budgeted Undesignated Offering for 2022: \$288,676.61 Budgeted undesignated offering as of the end of November: \$264,620.23 Total received as of the end of *November*: \$229,463.51

From the Treasurer

We need to raise an additional \$30,000 by the end of December to eliminate our current operating deficit for this year.

The Parish did not add to the deficit in October 2022, leaving us with a \$24k deficit (the equivalent



I can point out about \$10k in unbudgeted expenses. If undesignated offerings were up to 83% we would be running a small surplus of \$3000 - \$4000. October was a good first step to ending the year on a positive fiscal note. Let us each consider what sacrificial giving means in our own lives as we enter into Advent.

Nave Windows

You have probably noticed plywood covering two windows in the nave of the church. These windows were recently removed and taken off site so they can be restored. They should be back in place *very soon*. The funding for this work is being provided through our annual maintenance budget which comes from money you put in the offering plate (i.e. non-designated offerings).

Return of the Common Chalice

During the early stages of the COVID-19 pandemic the administration of the Chalice at the Holy Communion was restricted by many churches throughout the world. With no evidence that it has ever been a cause for spreading illness, including during the current pandemic, it has returned in many places in Canada, the United States, and throughout the world, including in many dense urban areas. This has been noticed by many of us who have traveled recently. After consulting with Bishop Sandra, and at the request of Parish Council, the Rector and Wardens submitted a plan to the bishop to restore the Common Chalice at St George's. We are very grateful to her for granting us permission to resume the practice on the Feast of All Saints', last Tuesday, November 1st. Please be assured that no one wanting to partake in the Holy Communion is required to receive the Chalice. The full grace of the Sacrament is assured in receiving the Bread or the Wine alone. If you do not wish to receive the Chalice at the altar rail, please cross your arms over your chest after you have received the Bread. If you have any questions, please speak with Fr Hatt.
