

Financial Update

Total Budgeted Undesignated Offering for 2022: \$288,676.61 Budgeted undesignated offering as of the end of *November*: \$264,620.23

Total received as of the end of November:

\$229,463.51

From the Treasurer

The parish added about \$8000 to the deficit in November, bringing it to a total of \$32,333.65. Monthly undesignated offerings required by the budget: \$23,875.63.

Budgeted undesignated offerings to the end of November: \$262,631.98

Deficit in UNDESIGNATED OFFERINGS, end November

2022: \$33,168.46 (Looks a lot like the total deficit).

Undesignated offerings needed in December to make the 2022 budget for undesignated offerings: \$57,044.09.

To be clear, designated offerings cannot change an operating deficit in our parish. Designated offerings count both as income and expense. They are set aside for the purpose for which they were given, and only count as income once they are spent. As such they cancel themselves out and sum to zero. Excess designated offerings cannot improve the deficit situation; they must be held for the purpose they were given (Diocesan Canon 37, s.1-3). Conversely, if designated offerings do not meet the budgeted amount for any given project, the deficit for that project comes out of undesignated offerings.

Drafting the budget starts the moment I receive the end December/end of year financial in early January. If the parish ends the year with a significant deficit, that process will require some difficult decisions to be made by your parish council.

Return of the Common Chalice

During the early stages of the COVID-19 pandemic the administration of the Chalice at the Holy Communion was restricted by many churches throughout the world. With no evidence that it has ever been a cause for spreading illness, including during the current pandemic, Bishop Sandra Fyfe gave permission for St George's to restore use of the Common Chalice last month. No one wanting to partake in the Holy Communion is required to receive the Chalice. The full grace of the Sacrament is assured in receiving the Bread or the Wine alone. If you do not wish to receive the Chalice at the altar rail, please cross your arms over your chest after you have received the Bread and say "Amen" to acknowledge the Sacrament. If you have any questions, please speak with Fr Hatt.
