We will remember George during our 8 a.m. and 10:30 a.m. services, with appropriate Scripture readings, music, and special crafts in Sunday School. Come and celebrate the life of this mysterious saint who battled against spiritual wickedness in the early Roman Empire and is the patron and protector of our Round Church. We are also pleased to be able to borrow and will carry in procession that day the Saint George Banner from the King's College Chapel which was commissioned in the mid 2010s as a memorial to The Rev'd Dr Robert Crouse.

In recent months, numerous cracks had appeared in the ceiling below the gallery, running between the outside wall by the window closest to the Brunswick Street doors south side and the inside column. We were able to find a heritage plasterer, Mario Mercer of Domar Interiors to inspect the severity of the cracks and then to perform the necessary repairs. Mr. Mercer is experienced working in heritage buildings: he has conducted renovations at Province House and was involved in the latest plastering job at the Little Dutch Church. This work has begun and should be completed shortly. Painting of the repaired area to match the ceiling will happen shortly.
