Last Week, April 30: Team 4 led by Alex Bickerton. Food and volunteers came from St. Paul's Anglican Church Youth Group. 130 were served.

Yesterday, May 7: Team 5 led by Jordan Gracie. Food and volunteers came from Bedford Baptist.

Next week, May 14: Team 6 led by Jordan Gracie. Food and volunteers will come from All Saints' Bedford.

The parish office will be closed this Monday to allow a day off this week for our Parish Administrator who is leading Soup Kitchen on Saturday.

Junior Choir in the Kiwanis Music Festival

The Junior Choir received Gold for their performance in the Kiwanis Music Festival on Wednesday of Easter Week. The adjudicator praised the choir for its discipline, poise and musicality, noting also their fine physical alignment and healthy vocal tone. Advance Notice

The **2022 Atlantic Theological Conference** will take place at St. Paul's Church in Sackville, New Brunswick from June 26th - 29th. The topic of this year's conference will be *Plague, Perseverance, Providence: Adversity and the Christian Response to Adversity*. A number of St. George's parishioners and people known to our parish will be speaking at this conference. Among others, speakers will include The Rev Dr Thomas Curran, Mary Lu Redden, The Rev Colin Nicolle, Peter Bryson, The Rev Dr Gary Thorne, Amy Bird and Dr Neil Robertson. Topics to be considered will be: Biblical responses to adversity; Plagues and Adversity in Antiquity; Representations of Plague and Adversity in art; and Illness and Repentance: The Prayer Book Response to Affliction. As more information becomes available, further updates will follow.

Bluenose Marathon, May 21st & 22nd

The Bluenose Marathon will be held on the 21st and 22nd of May. Please give yourself lots of time to get to church on that day.

The organizers have advised area churches that "participant traffic will be heaviest in the North End from 8:00 am until 10:30 am" with roughly 3,450 coming through the area.

Runners will be using Agricola, Barrington, Cornwallis, and North Streets this year (with the full marathon crossing the McDonald Bridge and circling Lake Banook in Dartmouth), so plan accordingly.

Update on Little Dutch Church cemetery wall

A few weeks ago, Parks Canada informed the parish that our application for funds to restore the first section for the dry stone wall along the Gerrish Street side of the cemetery had been successful. Parks Canada will provide up to \$120,000 (50%) towards the restoration, and the parish must put forward the matching funds. We have submitted a number of applications to various local, municipal, and provincial agencies, and we await their decisions over the next few weeks. This past week we learned that the Halifax Foundation will provide \$15,000 and the Nova Scotia Heritage Trust will provide \$2,500 towards these matching funds. We are planning for the work to begin this August. A special thank you to our property chair, Jacquie de Mestral for her leadership on this project.

Wondrous Love: Old Time Gospel Music

St. Margaret of Scotland Anglican Church invites the community to Wondrous Love: a special evening service featuring church music from the folk traditions of Appalachia and the American South. Local musicians Jude Pelley, Dane George, Jay Perry, and Rebecca Fairless will be performing a selection of shape note hymns, bluegrass tunes, and old time gospel music. There will also be scripture readings and a message from the Rector of St. Margaret of Scotland, Rev. Ed Trevors. A collection will be taken in support of St Margaret's youth and family ministry.

Mark your calendars! On Sunday, June 19th at 7pm the Parish Choir will present G. F. Handel's 'Utrecht' Te Deum. This festive work was composed by Handel in celebration of the Peace Treaty of Utrecht, marking the end of the War of Spanish Succession in 1713. It was first performed in St Paul's Cathedral in London in July of 1713. Richly scored for soloists, choir, strings, trumpets, oboes, flauto traverso, bassoon and continuo, the Utrecht Te Deum will be a feast for the senses.

This concert is the first of its scale since the choir performed Bach's Magnificat in D, just weeks before the Pandemic reached our shores. Admission will be a suggested donation of \$20. Proceeds will be directed to the Friends of Saint George's Society, toward the Music Programme.
