Update on Little Dutch Church cemetery wall

This past week we learned that Parks Canada has approved our application for funding to restore the first section of the dry stone wall along the Gerrish Street side of the cemetery. Parks Canada will provide up to \$120,000 (50%) towards the restoration, and the parish must put forward matching funds. We have submitted a number of applications to various local and provincial funding agencies, and we await their decisions in the next few weeks.
