





Financial Update for Epiphany 1, January 7th

As of Thursday January 4th, the December offerings stand at \$68,062.31! Parishioners from all kinds of financial means have stretched to support the ministries and fabric of this parish. It has been very moving to witness this response to the deficit reduction campaign. Deo Gratias!

While there are still a few details to finalize it looks like we'll be ending the year with small deficit of ~\$1300. We had some unexpected expenses through the year, so to be this close to a break-even shows tremendous commitment to the parish and our life together.

Works of Robert Crouse Book Launch - January 14th

On Sunday, January 14th St George's will host (with King's College) the launch of the publication of a series of works by the late Father Robert Crouse, a Canadian theologian, priest, and professor whose teaching legacy continues to be a source of inspiration and renewal for many Anglican parishes such as ours.

The Rt Rev'd Victoria Matthews, former Suffragan Bishop of Toronto, Bishop of Edmonton, and Bishop of Christchurch in the Anglican Church in Aotearoa, New Zealand and Polynesia will be our guest preacher that morning. Bishop Matthews was Chair of the Primate's Theological Commission for the Anglican Church of Canada when Father Crouse was a member of the Commission.
