Financial Update

Total Budgeted Undesignated Offering for 2022: \$288,676.61
Total received as of the end of *December*: \$297,032.71

Notes from the Treasurer

The parish ended the year with a surplus of \$2303.22. We also exceeded budgeted undesignated offerings by about \$10.5k - not too bad having entered December needing over \$50k to make the budgeted amount for undesignated offerings. However, you will no doubt notice that \$2.3k is less than \$10.5k. Everything has gone up in cost, and that hits our parish twice. First, it costs us more to do what we do. Second, it increases the needs of our neighbours and those we serve.



SCAN ME TO GIVE

We as parishioners are not "donors". The money you give is not a "donation" (CRA-think excepted). We offer up to God some of that which he has provided to us as our means allow. It is a way of life, a calling of and to all Christians (and our Abrahamic Brothers and Sisters as I understand it). Jesus tells us in no uncertain terms that there will always be the poor. We cannot spend our way around that one. We can give sacrificially with hope and charity and love in our heart as best we can, and continue to do so for as long as this life allows.

In case you see a bit of a preamble for the 2023 budget to be presented at the AGM in February, you are not wrong. Please come and participate, or at least listen, in that process. It defines what the parish can do materially in the coming year. While we are exhorted not to be of the world, we are to live in it, both individually and as a parish in God's Church. Bless all of you who have given, and will give in the future.

This is one of my final notes to the parish. I will not be re-offering as the parish Treasurer in the coming year. It has been an interesting three years. Suggestions/nominations for the position of Parish Treasurer welcomed, and requested by the Nominations Committee. Contact a Warden or the Rector if you wish to put your name forward or nominate someone else. I wish the new Treasurer all the best as we carry on in these uncertain times.

Feast of Candlemas - this Thursday!

We celebrate the Feast of the Presentation (Candlemas) this Thursday at 7 p.m. with Choral Holy Communion. The Rector will preach. Candlemas marks the fortieth day after Christmas, when Jesus was presented in the Temple, according to ancient Jewish custom. There, Jesus is met by the aged Simeon and Anna who had long awaited the birth of their Saviour. On Candlemas the whole congregation carries lighted candles in procession, according to ancient Christian custom, proclaiming Jesus (in Simeon's own words) as "a light to lighten the Gentiles, / and the glory of thy people Israel."

Epiphany Reading Group: George Eliot's *Adam Bede*

Wednesdays 7:00-8:30, January 18-February 15
in the Parish Hall, Guild Room

George Eliot's first full-length novel is set in 1799, at the very turn of the nineteenth century, "a time of impending change for England and the wider world." But the change it depicts takes a deeply personal form for the small rural community that is its setting, when an ill-advised "forbidden love" shatters the peace and challenges the faith of all of its members. We will be reading the novel over five weeks, covering about 100 pages each week. Here is a rough schedule:

January 18: BOOK I, Chapters 1-11

January 25: BOOK I, Chapters 12-16; BOOK II (Chapters 17-21)

February 1: BOOK III (Chapters 22-26); BOOK IV (Chapters 27-35)

February 8: BOOK V (Chapters 36-48)

February 15: BOOK VI (Chapters 49-55); Epilogue.

Music Director's Sabbatical

Last Tuesday, Parish Council approved a three-month sabbatical for our music director, Garth MacPhee, as part of our Music Program Renewal as we emerge from COVID. Garth will be traveling to Cambridge, England (February 14th to March 21, from Quinquagesima returning during the Fourth Week of Lent) for a month of study and renewal, with two more months to be determined at a later date. In Cambridge Garth will be observing choral rehearsals and liturgies, having private tutelage in conducting, organ and singing. He will focus particularly on learning methods of pedagogy related to the training of the Girl and Boy Choristers at Ely Cathedral which he hopes will help shape his approach to the choral programme at St George's, especially in relation to young singers. Garth will be under the tutelage of Sarah MacDonald, who was music director here at St George's from 1995-1997 and is now University Organist at the University of Cambridge, Director of Music in Chapel at Selwyn College, and

Director of the Girls' Choir at Ely Cathedral.

While Garth will continue to receive a salary while he is away, he will be responsible for paying his travel and accommodation costs. These include air and ground transit, health insurance, food, phone, and accommodation in Cambridge. The Parish has created a fund for Music Program Renewal, which will enable us to reimburse these costs and other expenses associated with the music program's evolution.

We are hoping to raise \$3000 for this mini sabbatical, not only to show our appreciation for the wonderful work that Garth does here in the parish, but for the great benefit it will be to our music program and to the life of the church. Offerings can be made by placing cash or cheque in the offering plate or via e-transfer to treasurer@roundchurch.ca. Please mark these gifts "Music Program Renewal". Any donation will receive a tax-receipt. Anything that we may raise over and above this amount will be put in a fund for future professional development/study and renewal opportunities for our Music Director, possibly as early as this summer or fall, should the funds be available.

During Garth's absence, our own Andrew Pickett will direct the choir and Dr Neil Cockburn, Director of Music at King's College Chapel will be our organist. We are blest to have the gifts of these talented and highly skilled professional musicians among us.
