By offering them to thee our Lord and God, may we be inflamed with the fire of thy love, and made worthy to be presented in the holy temple of thy glory. Through the same thy Son Jesus Christ our Lord, who with thee, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, liveth and reigneth God, world without end.



Worship during the Pandemic

During this time of pandemic, please...

Financial Update for Year End 2021

The parish finished the year 2021 with a modest \$35,400 surplus. The CEWS (Canada Emergency Wage Subsidy, a Federal COVID wages program) provided around \$40k, without which the parish income was \$4.6k below expenditures. The parish spent \$47k less than the budget of about \$400k, \$40k of that being stipend covered by CEWS. Total offerings were \$14k less than 2020. It is difficult to draw many conclusions on all these numbers due to COVID, but they do look a little soft despite the surplus.

The parish increased its cash balance by nearly \$90k in 2021, with \$35k of that being the accumulation of unrestricted cash, and the rest being mostly additions to the Rector's Discretionary Short-Term fund (\$13.5k), new donations to the Curacy Short-Term fund (\$31.5k), and disbursements from the Preservation Endowment that weren't spent in 2021 (\$2.5k).

Overall, the Lord provided and the parish did well with those provisions. There are a number of challenges coming up for 2022 – COVID continues and we have a major capital project in rebuilding the LDC graveyard wall on Gerrish Street, to name two. We need the loaves and fishes that the Lord may multiply. I encourage us all to continue to examine our ability to give and to do as we are able.
