Financial update for March 3rd

Thank you to everyone who attended our Annual General Meeting on February 11th and for your attentiveness to the budget proposal for the coming year. The proposed 2024 budget was passed without amendment. You can review the details in the Annual Report online at https://www.roundchurch.ca/s/Annual-Report-2023-reduced-size.pdf and there are still print copies of the Annual Report available at the back of the church.

As indicated at the AGM, the income for the Friends of St George's Society (FSGS) stipend fund will appear in the financial updates in the bulletin. While these funds do not pass through the parish books, they do have an effect on our undesignated offerings goal for a balanced budget. In January, the FSGS received \$500 in offerings for stipends for parish staff. The fund had an additional \$1520 as of the end of December, so the FSGS support for February stipends is \$2000.

Lenten Book Study: Images of Pilgrimage by The Rev'd Dr Robert Crouse
