2023 Atlantic Theological Conference

The parish has been a sustaining feature of the Church's witness for centuries. It identifies not only a building and a community of regular church-goers; it embraces an entire locality, with its varying seasons and transformations, its enduring memories and aspirations, and knits them together around a centre of prayer and sacrament. For many it is a ubiquitous structure of Christian experience, the site of all our comings and goings, but the very invisibility of its blessings means that its presence is often overlooked. This Conference examines the roots of parish life, and invites us to consider the challenges that face it and the possibilities that lie before it.
