



There are a number of opportunities in our parish to undertake Lenten disciplines of "self-examination and repentance, prayer, fasting, and self-denial, and reading and meditation upon God's holy Word" (BCP, p. 612).

Daily Offices

The daily offices of Morning and Evening Prayer are said at 8 a.m. and 5:30 p.m. each weekday in the Round Church, and last about 30 minutes each. Attending these offices is an easy way to schedule more time for daily prayer in your week.

Lenten Book Study: Images of Pilgrimage by The Rev'd Dr Robert Crouse

A series of meditations on the theological, philosophical, and literary history of pilgrimage: Sunday evenings during Lent at 6 p.m. led by Rhea Bright (former student of Fr Crouse and author of the accompanying study guide) and by parishioner Neil Robertson (former student and colleague of Fr Crouse). Today, we gather as a parish family, with a nod to this tradition. All are welcome!
