

Lenten Book Study: Images of Pilgrimage by The Rev'd Dr Robert Crouse

A series of meditations on the theological, philosophical, and literary history of pilgrimage: Sunday evenings during Lent at 6 p.m. led by Rhea Bright (former student of Fr Crouse and author of the accompanying study guide) and by parishioner Neil Robertson (former student and colleague of Fr Crouse).
