The Lenten Fast

The Book of Common Prayer (page xiii) directs all Christians to observe the following days of fasting, abstinence, and solemn prayer during Lent:

Major fast days: Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. On both these days, from sunrise to sundown, we should try to go without food and water during the day.

Days of Abstinence: The Forty Days of Lent (this excludes the Sundays in Lent). On these days we should eat simple, smaller meals, and undertake other forms of self-denial, giving up a luxury or indulgence.

Days of Solemn Prayer: The Lenten Ember Days being the Wednesday, Friday, and Saturday after the First Sunday in Lent. On these days we should spend extra time in daily prayer and try our best to attend the Holy Communion.

Some people are not able to undertake these disciplines for reasons of health and wellness

Sung Evensong and Meditations on Sundays

Throughout Lent, a sung Evensong with organ accompaniment will be held on Sunday evenings at 5 p.m. in the Chancel of the Round Church, with a meditation offered on the Scripture readings appointed for that day by various parishioners. Consider making these Evensongs a part of your Lenten discipline of increased attention to the divine Word.

Lenten Study Group: "Life in Death"

Tuesday evenings, March 10th, 17th, 24th and 31st. 7 p.m. to 8:30 p.m.

Led by the Rector, using readings from some of the early Christian martyrs and Orthodox theologian John Behr, we consider how our suffering and death is transformed by Christ's Passion, Death, and Resurrection and becomes what one martyr calls the "beginning of life". The Doctrine of Concomitance and Receiving only the Bread and/or Wine

For centuries, the church has upheld the Doctrine of Concomitance, preserved by Anglicans in Article XXX of the Articles of Religion in the Book of Common Prayer, which teaches that Jesus Christ is indivisible, his body is inseparable from his blood, and therefore he is fully present in both the bread and wine at the Holy Communion. For reasons of illness or allergy, some people may wish to receive “in one kind only”, i.e. only the bread or only the cup at the Holy Communion. You may do so in full assurance that you are receiving the fullness of Christ. You can indicate this at the Communion rail by crossing your hands over your chest when the bread or wine is about to be administered to you. Please feel free to speak with Father Hatt or Father Harris if you have questions.

YouthNet Update

YouthNet’s afterschool program has seen a few changes over the past two weeks. Unfortunately, one of the youth chose to leave the program, but on the positive side of this decision we were able to welcome two more youth into the program, who were very keen to join. Last Thursday Kelsy from the house of Eights Dance studio came in, and the Halifax Brazilian Jiu jitsu Society gave a lesson at their gym up the road from YouthNet. This Thursday we made birdhouses and tacos. Keep your eye out for a birdhouse or two in the courtyard.

The teen program has doubled in size over the past two weeks. This poses several new challenges, but it is very exciting to see many new faces with so much sweetness and talent. I hope because of teen program friendships continue to deepen.

YouthNet School Lunches

I am looking for two more people to provide lunch once a month for Saint George’s YouthNet’s Lunch Program. If you are interested, it would mean signing up for one day a month (say, the 4th Monday) to provide lunches for 36 kids, which could be a tray and half of shepherd’s pie, or a few roast chickens with a bag of rice. If cooking’s not your thing, you might consider donating \$50/month which would cover the cost of lunches for one day. Support for the Kleven/Stones Family

TODAY is the last day to make a contribution to this fund.

On New Year's Eve day the minivan being driven by the sister-in-law of Elisabeth Stones (St George's chorister and former Parish Administrator) slipped off the road and into a pond near her family's home in South Bend, Indiana. Brooke and her three children were in the van, which became fully submerged in the pond.

Brooke's husband Christopher (Elisabeth's brother) was at work at the time. Brooke and baby Hendrik (age 3 months) survived. Tragically, James (age 4) and Natalie (age 2) died. Brooke and the baby are recovering but will continue to require lengthy ongoing rehabilitation and treatment.

A number of people have asked how they can send funds to support the Kleven family's medical and funeral expenses. St George's is able to pass along funds. While we are not able to issue charitable tax receipts for donations to individuals or families, by sending the money as a lump sum we will alleviate banking fees so that 100% of the funds collected go to the family.
