

Holy Week 2024 at St George's

There are more than twenty services and events happening at St George's this week to help guide you in your pilgrimage to the Cross and the Empty Tomb this Holy Week and Easter. Here is some information about our two guest speakers this year:

Marilyn Orr will offer the meditation at the Choral Holy Communions at 7pm on Holy Monday and on Holy Tuesday and on Maundy Thursday. For more than two decades Dr. Orr taught English at the university level, with a focus on nineteenth century British literature. In her retirement she is a fervent supporter of ecological justice, and a parish warden and head of spiritual development here at St George's.

The Rev'd Patrick Bright will offer the meditations on Christ's Seven Last Words from the Cross at the Three Hour Service on Good Friday, beginning at 12 noon.

Father Bright retired from Parish ministry in 2019, after nearly 25 years as Rector of All Souls' Episcopal Church in Oklahoma City. Previously, he served in parishes in rural Nova Scotia and Savannah, Georgia. He and his wife, Rhea now live in her grandparents' former home on the South Shore of Nova Scotia. He assists regularly in various parishes throughout our Diocese, including St George's.
