## **Worship during the Pandemic**

The ongoing COVID-19 pandemic means that we must take extra precautions to help prevent the further spread of the virus. While in the church, please...

- wear a mask;
- clean your hands upon arriving;
- check in with the greeter to record your name;
- do not sit in the pews marked off with a ribbon;
- refrain from shaking hands and try to cough or sneeze into your elbow.

At the time of the Holy Communion (during the 10:30 a.m. service only), please remain seated until the greeter has signaled that it is time for you to go. Those sitting around the outside aisles and the upstairs Gallery will go first, followed by those sitting around the centre aisle.

There are two stations for receiving the Sacrament, one on each side of the Communion rail. We ask that only one person or household go to each station at a time.

Upon leaving the Communion rail, please turn to the left and go through the vestry door or follow the arrows back down the central aisle of the chancel. (The latter may be easier for those with mobility problems).

At the end of the service, please exit the church using one of the three exits: the vestry door (side door to your left), the door to the parking lot (side door to your right), or the Brunswick Street doors, leaving your prayer books in the box provided at the door. If physically possible, please consider using the Brunswick Street door, especially if you are seated near the back of the church.

At all times, we must observe physical distancing in the church, keeping six feet or two metres from those outside of your family or household.

If you have travelled or have been in direct contact with someone who has travelled outside of Nova Scotia within the last fourteen days or are feeling unwell and have symptoms of COVID-19, please do not come to church. Let the Rector know if you are unwell so we can offer our care and our prayers for you.

## **TODAY - Parish Annual General Meeting**

Following today's 10:30 a.m. worship we will meet in the church for the Annual General Meeting. Public health officials have given permission for churches in Nova Scotia to hold in-person Annual General Meetings if the meeting takes place immediately after worship with people physically distanced and wearing masks. We also need to limit the length of the meeting as much as possible. Our main items of business therefore will be to receive the financial reports, approve the Budget for 2021, and elect officers for the coming year. Please read beforehand the reports of our various groups and ministries. If there are any pressing questions or issues we can discuss those, but otherwise we will receive them in written form only, without an oral presentation of each report. If you have any questions please speak with the wardens or Rector. Pandemic restrictions also mean that we cannot provide any refreshments so feel free to bring along a snack!

## Tuesday evenings during Lent: Reading the Book of Exodus

The Anglican Church of Canada's National Indigenous Archbishop has commended for use in parishes a practice of communal Scripture reading called "Gospel based discipleship" which is used in some Indigenous communities. After reading a passage of Scripture, three questions are put before the group: What words, ideas, or phrases stand out for you? What is Jesus saying to you? What is Jesus calling you to do? This is not a Bible study or program, but an opportunity for us to place the Word at the centre of our lives and discover the ways in which we are being called to a deeper repentance and love for the world. We will attempt this using the Book of Exodus (which we read during Morning and Evening Prayer during Lent) beginning on Tuesday, February 23rd until Tuesday, March 16th. All are welcome. No prior study or knowledge is necessary. You need only come with an open heart. Sessions will last for 45 minutes, starting at 8 p.m. If you would like to join, please email Father Hatt (rector@roundchurch.ca). If you are not computer literate but would still like to join, please let him know and we will try to find a way. It may be possible to use your cell phone to join in, too.

## **Offering Plate**

Last Sunday the offering was stolen at the 10:30 a.m. service. There was a witness and the matter has been reported to the police. Many people are using direct debit and etransfers to make their offering to the parish, so the loss was less than it might have been, but nonetheless it is quite distressing. If you bring an offering to the church, please give it directly to one of the greeters who will bring it forward during the offertory hymn and ensure it is placed in a secure location.

Ashes will be administered in the same manner as the Holy Communion. The clergy will be masked and will sanitize their hands beforehand. Please come to the communion rail wearing your mask, with only one person or household per side. If you are anxious about receiving ashes during COVID-19, please know that it is not necessary to receive ashes in order to participate fully in the liturgy. The administration of ashes is not a sacramental act (like the Holy Communion or Baptism) but is an act of penance and humility. Participating in the penitential prayers without receiving ashes is certainly sufficient.
