

ADVENT STUDY: Meditating on Advent with Evelyn Underhill

This year we are offering a four-week study meant to prepare our hearts for Advent, using a book designed for just this purpose, "Music of Eternity: Meditations for Advent with Evelyn Underhill." We will meet for a brief discussion time on the four Sundays leading up to Christmas, immediately following our usual 5pm Evening Prayer (and after Advent Lessons and Carols on December 10th), **starting TODAY**, **the Sunday Next Before Advent, November 26th.**

The book is divided into four Parts, with each Part subdivided into smaller sections for daily reading. We will read the designated Part on our own through the week and then meet on Sunday evenings for a discussion, with each week led by a different parishioner.



Financial Update for the Sunday Next Before Advent

At last February's AGM, the parish took on a challenging budget in support of the parish ministries. Offerings have varied over the course of the year, with some months (May and October) being above the monthly budget target and most months being below.



We had some unexpected expenses in the Round Church and parishioners responded with largesse, exceeding the amount we needed for the immediate repairs. Thank you all.

However (you knew there was a however) at the end of October, 83% through the year, offerings were at 75% of budget. *As of November 23, we still have a deficit of just over* \$38,000.

We ask you all to reflect and pray about this challenge, and consider how you can help.

As you do this, we encourage you to make your contributions to "undesignated offerings". It might help to think of undesignated offerings as operational offerings, which go toward the care and upkeep of the church properties, the salaries of our Rector, Music Director, and Parish Administrator, electricity, heat and all the things that allow *all* of our activities as a congregation, as well as our outreach ministries, to happen. While offerings designated to individual ministries, such as Soup Kitchen, YouthNet, Christmas outreach and the Music Program, are encouraged and very much appreciated, we hope that these will be given in addition to, rather than instead of, offerings towards the general operation of the church. Please keep in mind that offerings designated to a specific ministry, may only be used for that purpose and do not help to make up the deficit, whereas, if any of these ministries are short on funds, the difference is made up out of the undesignated (or operational) offerings.

We know that many parishioners are already giving sacrificially to our parish. Some of you have already responded to our announcement about the deficit and we are very grateful to have your support.

When churches speak about stewardship, we often use the story of the widow's mite, and talk about "time, talents, and treasure". We have heard these stories so often that they can sound like clichés; yet the truth is that we cannot continue to function as a parish unless each of us consider how we might serve God here in this place by participating in ministries as we are able - which could be volunteering, or simply praying. Every person counts; every offering, however small, helps us eliminate the deficit. Prayer can accomplish more than we can imagine. There is a very handy prayer for the parish on page 44 of the prayer book.

O God the Holy Ghost, Sanctifier of the faithful; Sanctify this parish by thine abiding presence. Bless those who minister in holy things. Enlighten the minds of thy people more and more with the lights of the everlasting Gospel. Bring erring souls to the knowledge of God our Saviour: and those who are walking in the way of life, keep steadfast unto the end. Give patience to the sick and afflicted, and renew them in body and soul. Guard from forgetfulness of thee those who are strong and prosperous. Increase in us thy manifold gifts of grace, and make us all to be fruitful in good works; O blessed Spirit, whom with the Father and the Son together we worship and glorify, one God, world without end.

Let us together, and individually pray with purpose, about what we can do to nurture and support the work of the church.

We will provide updates each week until the 2023 books are closed.
