

## **Worship during the Pandemic**

The ongoing COVID-19 pandemic means that we must take extra precautions to care for our neighbour and help prevent the further spread of the virus. While in the church, please...

- wear a mask. Please speak to a greeter if you need one.
- clean your hands upon arriving in the church (hand sanitizer is available at the door)
- check-in with the greeter and make sure your name is recorded (this is required in the event that health authorities need to conduct contact tracing)
- refrain from sitting in the pews marked off with a ribbon
- refrain from shaking others' hands
- cough or sneeze into your elbow
- at the time of Communion during the 10:30 a.m. service, we ask that
  members of the congregation remain in their pews until the greeter or
  sidesperson has indicated that it is time for them to go forward. This is
  necessary to ensure we maintain proper physical distancing while in
  line to receive the Sacrament, now that there are larger numbers of
  people attending.
- exit the church using the vestry door (side door to your left) and drop your prayer book in the box at the door.

At all times, please observe physical distancing in the church, keeping six feet or two metres from those outside of your family or household. This is especially important when arriving or leaving the church and when approaching the altar to receive the Holy Communion.

If you have travelled or have been in direct contact with someone who has travelled outside of Nova Scotia or the Atlantic 'bubble' within the last fourteen days, or are feeling unwell and have symptoms of COVID-19 please do not come to church. Let the Rector know if you are unwell so we can offer our care and our prayers for you!

# **Update from the Finance Warden**

In the past few months we have been reporting a budget surplus for the parish. The financial statements to the end of August show the surplus has grown to approximately \$46 000. We are thankful for this and for the support of all who have continued to make their offering to the parish so faithfully. However, we must not be complacent. Most of this surplus is due to wage subsidies from the federal government, received through the diocese, and the receipt of grant money and the HST Rebate. Monthly offerings have been tapering off over the summer. Our monthly net income has been on a downward trend since May. We cannot be sure we will continue to receive wage subsidies to the end of the year. Rental income is slowly increasing as groups gradually resume meeting in the Church and Hall (with COVID restrictions as required) and we are hopeful that with proper precautions these meetings can continue. As people gradually return to work, parking income is increasing as well.

Thank you to all who have made contributions to the fund to repair the roof and paint the exterior of the Round Church. To date we have received about \$2200 of the required \$25 000. We hope to meet our goal by the end of the year. Information about how to contribute is on a separate sheet. Every little bit helps, many small contributions are as good as a few large ones.

### **Update from Deck the Hall**

It has been a while since we have had a meaningful update so DTH wanted to share our progress in the last many months. We have secured pricing to remove the chimney that used to exhaust the old furnace. It runs from the basement through the main hall to the roof. It will make room for a new closet in the upper hall for Soup Kitchen. We got a pricing update from the contractor for the entire music room renovation. We are in the process of breaking it down into smaller parts to be able to phase in the work and also allow us to apply for very specific grants with pricing for a staged approach. We are hopeful that you will see work begin in the next few months moving us closer to having a music room underneath the hall.

# **Update on Repairs to the Round Church**

This summer we have undertaken three major maintenance projects in the Round Church. The first is the installation of a new natural gas furnace which was completed this week. Our old oil furnace and oil tanks had reached their end-of-life and were at risk of failing during the coming winter. Give thanks for a generous donor who has provided the resources which enabled us to undertake this project in such a timely fashion.

The second project is the painting of the upper exterior portion of the drum and the cupola. This work is well underway and should be finished in the next few weeks. Some rotten wood was found at the base of the cupola, but it was caught early and can be repaired fairly easily.

The third project is the re-shingling of the church roof. After nearly twenty-five years, the shingles are close to their end-of-life and need to be replaced before winter. This work is scheduled to begin in September and should last for a few weeks. This will involve the placement of staging around the church while the work is being done, but it should not be very disruptive.

# **Appeal for Funds for Repairs**

The total cost of the exterior painting and the re-shingling of the church is approximately \$80,000. We received a grant of \$10,000 from the Province of Nova Scotia and a grant of \$25,000 from the Municipality towards these two projects. Last week, Parish Council approved the transfer of \$20,000 from our short-term Preservation Fund to help pay for these projects. These monies are funds which have accumulated from the interest of the Preservation Endowment and can only be spent on the maintenance of the Round Church. This means that we have an overall shortfall of \$25,000 which we need to raise ourselves.
