Remembering the Queen and Praying for the King

Last Thursday, September 8th our sexton, Cameron Lowe, tolled the bell of the Round Church ninety-six times in memory of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II who died earlier in the day. Prayers for the repose of her soul and for the Accession of the King (that Almighty God would grant him a long and peaceful reign, with gifts of justice, truth, and charity, and would save him from the temptations of Empire) were said at Evening Prayer that day.

Memorial Services for Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II

Details about memorial services for Her Majesty the Queen will be available in the coming days. The Bishop's office has advised parishes that following the official funeral in the United Kingdom, a national memorial service for our country will be held at St James' Cathedral in Toronto, which will be live-streamed at www.anglican.ca. Once these services have been held, a diocesan service will be held at All Saints' Cathedral. This is tentatively scheduled for Monday, September 19th.

Deck the Hall Update

Recently Parish Council approved a plan to have some basic finish work done in the parish hall music room which should make the room available for use, while also allowing us the flexibility to easily make further modifications and upgrades to the space. That work will hopefully begin in the next few weeks. We have the funds on hand to pay for this next part of the project, but donations are always welcome by speaking with Al Wilson, our parish treasurer (treasurer@roundchurch.ca). Thank you to John-Mark Dawson for his leadership in this next phase of the music room project. Parish Council hopes to restart the overall renovation of the hall this autumn after the COVID hiatus. Update on Little Dutch Church Cemetery Wall

This week the restoration of the upper part of the dry stone wall along the Gerrish Street side of the cemetery was completed. Go and take a look! The Little Dutch Church is a municipal, provincial, and national heritage site, and the cemetery walls are considered a 'defining feature' of the property. Thank you to Jacquie de Mestral for the extensive work she has done over the past year working with Parks Canada, pulling together a team of expert dry stone wallers, architects, archaeologists, and heritage experts to complete this work. The project began two summers ago with the restoration of the Brunswick Street wall. The restoration of the upper part of the dry-stone wall along the Gerrish Street side of the cemetery was completed at the end of August.

Volunteers Needed! YouthNet Lunches

With yet another incredible summer behind us, YouthNet is now gearing up to begin our school year programming. Our Lunch Program -- made possible by the support of community members and local businesses -- is set to resume on Tuesday, September 20th. We are currently looking for volunteers to assist us in providing 36 lunches to the youth of Joseph Howe Elementary each day. Your help can include preparing lunches (at home, or in the YouthNet kitchen), providing supplies or financial assistance, or assisting with occasional transportation (dropping off lunches or trips to the store). Volunteers typically commit to one 36-portion meal a month, although we can be flexible with frequency and schedules. Charitable tax receipts will be provided for the cost of food upon request.
