For August 2022

The parish ran modest surpluses in June (\$3000), July (\$1000) and August (\$6500), reducing the deficit from \$21 000 at the end of May to \$11 500 at the end of August. The summer period is often a time of reduced giving and growing deficit historically. Given the longevity of the parish, I guess I shouldn't be surprised, but I am. Am grateful for the faithful giving of time, talent and treasure by you all to the parish and its works.

Memorial Services for Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II

A provincial multi-faith memorial service to remember Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth will be held on Monday, September 19th at 2 p.m. at the Cathedral Church of All Saints. The service is open to the public but seating will be limited and people are asked to arrive by 1:30 p.m. It will be live-streamed at https://www.youtube.com/nsgov. A national memorial service will be held at St James' Cathedral in Toronto at 4 p.m. AT and will be live-streamed at www.anglican.ca.

Michaelmas – September 28

The Feast of Saint Michael and All Angels will be celebrated with Choral Holy Communion on the eve, Wednesday, September 28th at 7 p.m. in the Round Church. The name "Michael" means "who is like unto God". In the Old Testament Michael is the great prince, the protector of the children of Israel (Daniel 12:1). In the New Testament (Revelation 12:7) he is the heavenly leader in the fight against all enemies of God. In celebrating this feast day we remember the angels and principalities who fight and against all manner of spiritual evil and wickedness on our behalf.

Update on Nave Windows Restoration

Earlier this summer, parts of the southside lower nave windows in the Round Church were removed to the workshop of Parsons Lumber for repairs (this heritage company rebuilt the sanctuary windows 6 years ago). You may well have noticed some missing sashes and storm windows; these are presently being worked on. Next week two window boxes with rotten sills will also be removed. Until these can be replaced, in approximately a month's time, the window holes will be covered in plywood. When all the component parts are ready for replacement, the windows will be reinstalled, with the addition of pulleys, so that the heavy sashes are easily openable in order to provide extra ventilation during hot weather.

This round of upkeep on the windows is the first since restoration after the fire. In 2021 we started the current round of window repairs with work on the northside lower nave windows. The plan in 2023 is to proceed with necessary repairs and upkeep on the upper southside nave windows; the northside upper windows do not require repairs at this time, only the installation of pulleys to make the presently openable window easier to operate.

Deck the Hall Update

Recently Parish Council approved a plan to have some basic finish work done in the parish hall music room which should make the room available for use, while also allowing us the flexibility to easily make further modifications and upgrades to the space. That work will hopefully begin in the next few weeks. We have the funds on hand to pay for this next part of the project, but donations are always welcome by speaking with Al Wilson, our parish treasurer (treasurer@roundchurch.ca). Thank you to John-Mark Dawson for his leadership in this next phase of the music room project. Parish Council hopes to restart the overall renovation of the hall this autumn after the COVID hiatus. Those interested in joining the committee should speak with the Rector or wardens.

Update on Little Dutch Church Cemetery Wall

The restoration of the upper part of the dry stone wall along the Gerrish Street side of the cemetery was completed at the end of August. Go and take a look! You can also see photos on our parish's Facebook Group. The Little Dutch Church is a municipal, provincial, and national heritage site, and the cemetery walls are considered a 'defining feature' of the property. Thank you to Jacquie de Mestral for the extensive work she has done over the past year working with Parks Canada, pulling together a team of expert dry stone wallers, architects, archaeologists, and heritage experts to complete this work. The project began three summers ago with the restoration of the Brunswick Street wall. The restoration of the upper part of the dry-stone wall along the Gerrish Street side of the cemetery was completed at the end of August.

Your help can include preparing lunches (at home, or in the YouthNet kitchen), providing supplies or financial assistance, or assisting with occasional transportation (dropping off lunches or trips to the store). Volunteers typically commit to one 36-portion meal a month, although we can be flexible with frequency and schedules. Charitable tax receipts will be provided for the cost of food upon request. Lunches can be delivered hot or frozen to YouthNet, located at 2221 Maitland Street.
