Worship during the Pandemic

The ongoing COVID-19 pandemic means that we must take extra precautions to help prevent the further spread of the virus. While in the church, please ...

- wear a mask;
- clean your hands upon arriving;
- check in with the greeter to record your name;
- do not sit in the pews marked off with a ribbon;
- refrain from shaking hands and try to cough or sneeze into your elbow.

At the time of the Holy Communion (during the 10:30 a.m. service only), please remain seated until the greeter has signaled that it is time for you to go. Those sitting around the outside aisles and the upstairs Gallery will go first, followed by those sitting around the centre aisle. There are two stations for receiving the Sacrament, one on each side of the Communion rail. We ask that only one person or household go to each station at a time.

Upon leaving the Communion rail, follow the arrows back down the central aisle of the chancel.

At the end of the service, please exit the church using the door to the parking lot (side door to your right), or the Brunswick Street doors, leaving your prayer books in the box provided at the door. If physically possible, please consider using the Brunswick Street door, especially if you are seated near the back of the church.

At all times, we must observe physical distancing in the church, keeping six feet or two metres from those outside of your family or household. It is tempting to chat with friends and newcomers at the back of the church at the end of the service, but it is best for people to gather for such conversations outdoors where distancing is easier.

If you have travelled or have been in direct contact with someone who has travelled outside of Nova Scotia within the last fourteen days or are feeling unwell and have symptoms of COVID-19, please do not come to church. Let the Rector know if you are unwell so we can offer our care and our prayers for you.

Weekday Daily Offices in the Little Dutch Church

Over the past few months many of the pandemic gathering restrictions have lifted but many people are still not comfortable gathering in larger groups, including attending church services. If you are feeling this way, consider attending Morning or Evening Prayer which is said in the Little Dutch Church at 9 a.m. and 5:30 p.m. each weekday. These are small services with one or two other people, and lasts about 25 minutes. Come and pray for your loved ones, the neighbourhood, and the world. World. On Monday, October 4th the Daily Offices will return to the Round Church.

Parish Music Programming for Toddlers, Children and Young People – Meeting TODAY after the 10:30 service

New Organ Scholar

Last Sunday we welcomed our new organ scholar, Gabriel O'Brien. Gabriel is a third year composition major at the Fountain School of Performing Arts at Dalhousie University. He will be studying organ with Garth MacPhee, our Director of Music. Gabriel has an extensive background in Church Music, having sung in Capella Regalis Men and Boys' Choir and the Kings Chapel Choir here in Halifax. He was Organ Scholar at both Kings Chapel and, more recently, the Cathedral Church of All Saints. In addition to his duties at St George's, Gabriel is also the Assistant Director of Capella Regalis. We welcome Gabriel and look forward to fostering his musical development and for the gift of music he brings to us.

Property Update

Parsons Lumber Company will be doing maintenance work on the lower level nave windows of the Round Church during the month of September. You might remember that the sanctuary windows were rebuilt by this company three years ago. They specialize in the restoration of heritage wooden windows, and will be reinstalling pulleys and hinging the storm windows so that the lower sashes will be easily openable. This will improve air circulation and ventilation in the building during the hot weather. A special thank you to Edmonds for providing the scaffolding. Parsons will also be replacing missing moldings on the exterior Brunswick Street doors, and some work on the bell of the Round Church. Monies for this work will come from the short-term Preservation Fund and undesignated offerings.

We have been awarded funds from HRM Community Grants Program to reinstall the bell in the Little Dutch Church. This work will be done by Parsons during the winter of 2021-22.

We also have a newly erected wooden fence outside the Hall on Maitland Street. Many thanks to Ian Porter and Alan Snook for construction of the fence and to the kids of YouthNet for painting the mural. Don't forget to go have a look at this wonderful project!

The chain link fence at the rear of the graveyard of the Little Dutch Church was also recently replaced and the work of clearing the underbrush and overgrowth has also begun. Many, many thanks for our property chair, Jacquie de Mestral for her constant care and attention to all of these and many other property projects.

YouthNet Update

YouthNet's summer programs have concluded and we are busy planning our after school programs which begun last week. Amongst our many activities, we hope to resume tutoring for our youth with students from King's College and are hoping to launch new music programming for our youth in partnership with the Maritime Conservatory. Thank you to all who support our programs with time, talent, treasure, and prayers
