Finance Update from the Treasurer

For August 2022

The parish ran modest surpluses in June (\$3000), July (\$1000) and August (\$6500), reducing the deficit from \$21 000 at the end of May to \$11 500 at the end of August. The summer period is often a time of reduced giving and growing deficit historically. Given the longevity of the parish, I guess I shouldn't be surprised, but I am. Am grateful for the faithful giving of time, talent and treasure by you all to the parish and its works.

Diocesan Synod – Postponed until May

Late last Friday (after printing last week's bulletin) we received notice that Diocesan Synod which was scheduled for October 14th to 16th has been postponed until next May due to the disruption caused by Hurricane Fiona throughout the Diocese.

Update from St George's YouthNet

This fall YouthNet is back to our school-year programming. Our Lunch Program provides 36 youths at Joseph Howe Elementary with lunch each day, thanks to the support of our wonderful donors and volunteer lunch providers. We're continuing to partner with LF bakery for fresh bread for Sandwich Wednesday. Our Afterschool Program is back running Mondays through to Thursdays afterschool this year, with Fridays reserved for our Music Program in partnership with the Maritimes Conservatory. Between these two programs we're working with about 26 kids, most of whom have previously been in our summer or school-year programs, or have had an older sibling in our programs before. We're delighted to continue to build relationships with these youths and their families as well as form new friendships with fresh faces at YouthNet.

Bible Study of the Book of Psalms:

Tuesdays at 7pm, October and November

The Psalms are, of course, an integral and vital part of our liturgy, and many of us feel a deeply personal connection to individual psalms. At the same time, the Psalms as a whole and individually will repay more intentional study and shared reflection. The Psalms are traditionally divided into five Books; we will use this grouping, but subdivide Book Five into two groups. Each week a different parishioner will lead the discussion, with each taking their own approach and focusing on two or three of the Psalms in that group for further discussion and reflection. Our shared aim will be to deepen our spiritual understanding.

This year the Halifax Humanities Society is excited to offer Halifax Thinks: The Early Modern World, a course that will confront the rise of modern thought in authors like Descartes, Rousseau, Hobbes, Kant, Jane Austen and many more. Students will receive 12 recorded lectures written and delivered by university professors which they can listen to at their convenience and will meet twice a month in an in-person tutorial where they discuss the work with a university professor and their fellow classmates.

This course is offered by donation. All proceeds go to support Halifax Humanities programs that offer non-credit education in the Humanities to adults living on low incomes, completely free of charge.
