This fall YouthNet is back to our school-year programming. Our Lunch Program provides 36 youths at Joseph Howe Elementary with lunch each day, thanks to the support of our wonderful donors and volunteer lunch providers. We're continuing to partner with LF bakery for fresh bread for Sandwich Wednesday. Our Afterschool Program is back running Mondays through to Thursdays afterschool this year, with Fridays reserved for our Music Program in partnership with the Maritime Conservatory. Between these two programs we're working with about 26 kids, most of whom have previously been in our summer or school-year programs, or have had an older sibling in our programs before. We're delighted to continue to build relationships with these youths and their families as well as form new friendships with fresh faces at YouthNet.

Bible Study on the Book of Psalms:

The Psalms are, of course, an integral and vital part of our liturgy, and many of us feel a deeply personal connection to individual psalms. Nave Windows

You have probably noticed plywood covering two windows in the nave of the church. These windows were recently removed and taken off site so they can be restored. They should be back in place by the end of November. The funding for this work is being provided through our annual maintenance budget which comes from money you put in the offering plate (i.e. non-designated offerings).

Return of the Common Chalice

During the early stages of the COVID-19 pandemic the administration of the Chalice at the Holy Communion was restricted by many churches throughout the world. With no evidence that it has ever been a cause for spreading illness, including during the current pandemic, it has returned in many places in Canada, the United States, and throughout the world, including in many dense urban areas. This has been noticed by many of us who have traveled recently. After consulting with Bishop Sandra, and at the request of Parish Council, the Rector and Wardens submitted a plan to the bishop to restore the Common Chalice at St George's. We are very grateful to her for granting us permission to resume the practice on the Feast of All Saints', last Tuesday, November 1st. Please be assured that no one wanting to partake in the Holy Communion is required to receive the Chalice. The full grace of the Sacrament is assured in receiving the Bread or the Wine alone. If you do not wish to receive the Chalice at the altar rail, please cross your arms over your chest after you have received the Bread. If you have any questions, please speak with Fr Hatt.

Remembrance Sunday

Sunday, November 13th is Remembrance Sunday. At both the 8 am and 10:30 am services that day we will remember those who served in the Armed Forces and died in conflict, along with civilians who have died as a result of war and the accidents of war. Galileo Baroque Choir sings The Joy of Bach

Galileo Baroque Choir will perform some of J.S. Bach's most celebrated choral works this month with "The Joy of Bach." The 18-voice chamber choir, made up of some of Halifax's finest choral musicians, will be joined by baroque specialists Garth MacPhee, continuo; Karen Langille and Lauren Klein, violins; Kirsty Money, viola; and Hilary Brown, cello. The programme will feature landmark pieces from Bach's career including the beloved Jesus, bleibet meine Freude (Jesu, Joy of Man's Desiring) and the pinnacle of his motets, Jesu, meine Freude.


Galileo Baroque Choir, founded in 2018, is Nova Scotia's only choir dedicated to the performance of baroque music. Conductor Andrew Pickett holds an M.Mus. in voice from Western University and a graduate diploma from the Royal College of Music, and has studied with early music legends Emma Kirkby, James Bowman, and Michael Chance. He has performed chamber music and opera in Europe, Canada and the United States, and has been a member of numerous professional ensembles including the Tafelmusik Chamber Choir. Andrew now serves on the teaching faculty of the Halifax Institute of Traditional and Early Music.

The concert will take place Sunday, November 13, 7:30 pm at the historic St George's Round Church, 2222 Brunswick St, Halifax (admission by donation, \$20 suggested).

Financial Update, end September 2022

To many, a picture says much in little time:

Undesignated Offerings by Month, 2019 - end Sept 2022



The parish ended September with a deficit a little over \$24 000. That is from an adjusted deficit of about \$15k last month. From the graph above, it isn't hard to see why. Undesignated offerings over the summer dropped to the lowest levels in at least the last four years. The current state of the economy has a negative impact directly on parish expenses and on those of our neighbours to whom we give support (and no doubt most or all of us individually). All is not lost. Parish unrestricted cash (money in the bank that isn't already spoken for) is \$10k above what is was in May, and that is a good thing. The cost for the Little Dutch Church (LDC) graveyard wall section is coming in under budget. However, if for no other reason, please consider your giving as to not make the treasurer grind his teeth until Christmastide. If one averages out the yearly undesignated offerings over 12 months, monthly giving should be ~24k. For July – September, we took in half of that. No doubt the LDC wall project was top of many minds and funds flowed that way. While all of us individually and as a parish continue to be squeezed by rapidly rising costs for very basic things like food, fuel, and electricity, so it is for our neighbours.

As we travel through Trinity season towards Advent, it may be a good time for each of us to review our own Rule of Life, and not just in giving (BCP p.555). We now seem to be living in "interesting times". There will be many who will need our help.

¹ My last update in the bulletin said ~\$11k. Some late invoices arrived late, bumping it to \$15k. We use an accrual accounting method, so we consider cost incurred when they happen, not when the bill arrives. For all of you suppliers out there, timely invoicing is appreciated.
