

Bluenose Marathon – Next Saturday and Sunday

The Bluenose Marathon will be taking place in Halifax next weekend, so please schedule extra traveling time to get to church. Organisers of the Marathon have reassured churches in the North End that they will accommodate worshippers.

The route this year runs the full length of the peninsula, starting at the corner of Bell Road & Sackville, going north on North Park and Agricola, coming back down south via Novalea and Barrington before climbing Cornwallis Street from Barrington to Creighton, and going Downtown via Cogswell. The marathon then does a loop of Downtown and the South End following Hollis, Inglis, and Young Ave. to Point Pleasant Park, then returns to Citadel Hill via Young Ave., South Park, and Rainnie Dr. The half marathon runs this route once; the full marathon does two laps of the route.

Traffic is expected to be heaviest in the North End between 8am and 9:30am, and heaviest in the South End between 9:00am and 10:30am.

If you are coming from Dartmouth, you should be safe coming to church using the Old Bridge and taking Gottingen, turning left onto Prince William, and then right onto Maitland; if you're coming from the West End, you are going to have to cross the marathon at some point. It is probably going to be safest to do so either at Agricola and North, or at North Park and Cunard.

Third Quarter Update from the Treasurer

The parish ended the third quarter of 2021 (the end of September) with a modest surplus of about \$15 000. This is good news. However, no report from the Treasurer would be complete without an "However", so here is it...

The parish has been receiving money from the Federal government through the diocese in the form of the Canadian Emergency Wage Subsidy (CEWS). From January to the end of September the parish has received about \$33 000. Without that money, we would be running a deficit of \$18 000. If we average out the total amount of undesignated offerings as agreed to in the budget over the months of January to September, or three quarters of the total \$291 000 for the year, we are behind in undesignated offerings by \$32 000. This is about the same amount that the parish has received from CEWS. We are under-spent in an number of categories to date, allowing for the current surplus. However, the heating season is coming up and there are a number of property related expenses to come due once the work is completed.

The government announced that CEWS ended on the 23rd of October. This is no longer a source of income for the parish. The requirements to qualify for the replacement program look to be such that the diocese will not qualify. What does this all mean? Last year we had tremendous generosity in giving towards major capital work on the Round Church and other bits of the property. This year I would suggest the "landing spot" for giving is undesignated funds. They are so necessary to the work of the parish, and allow for timely action to be taken by the Rector, Wardens and Parish Council when unexpected items or events present themselves. An example that comes to mind from this year was the cleaning up of the graveyard at the LDC. This activity took a long time to complete largely due to delays in getting the funding sorted from sources other than undesignated funds. When it became clear that work had to happen the parish was not in a surplus at that time.

Below is a graph of monthly undesignated offering from the last few years and this year to date. The overall trend for this year matches other years. However, I would reiterate that the 2021 budget was both one of hope and optimism. If we as a parish cannot reach the goal set in the budget for this year, the next budget committee would be in a position to start making some hard choices. CEWS will not be available to make up the difference next year.

Now, with all of that out of the way, I would like to thank all of the faithful donors, large and small, one-time and regular contributors. Your generosity is what allows St. George's to do what it does, and it gives me great comfort and confidence as we move through this year.
