



Financial update: November 15

Great news! We exceeded the monthly budget for offerings in October by \$1511.58!



Unfortunately, our costs were up in October so we ended up adding to the deficit.

- We paid our regular grant to YouthNet in October (\$5000) as a key part of parish ministries. We received \$740 in donations specified to YouthNet, so the remainder came from parish general funds
- We also absorbed \$3250 in stipends normally paid by the Friends of St George's Society. The Friends are not able to assist with parish stipends for the remainder of the year, so we'll have an additional \$3250 to parish costs for both November and December.
- \$2250 deposit on \$4500 cost of replacing the kitchen flooring in Trinity House.

At the end of October the parish operating deficit was \$51,000.

The budget committee is starting work on the 2024 budget this week and will be paying close attention to the parish priorities for the coming year.

Galileo Chamber Choir presents "Rosa Mystica"

Sunday, November 19 at 7:30pm here in the Round Church

On November 19, Galileo Chamber Choir presents Marian music from the 15th to 18th centuries with "Rosa Mystica." The program includes a wide array of devotional music, from the luminous brilliance of Josquin des Prez to the opulent harmonies of Zelenka, and featuring works by Lassus, Monteverdi, Charpentier and others. The concert will culminate with Vivaldi's colourful *Magnificat*, accompanied by baroque strings.

Galileo Chamber Choir, founded in 2018 and directed by Andrew Pickett, is dedicated to the performance of Renaissance and Baroque music. The concert will take place Sunday, November 19, 7:30 pm at St George's Round Church (admission by donation, \$20 suggested). "Rosa Mystica" will be the final concert of the inaugural Halifax Early Music Festival, held from November 17–21.

Halifax Early Music Festival

November 17-21, 2023

The first ever Halifax Early Music Festival will take place this November 17–21, 2023. The festival, which will feature four concerts of Renaissance and Baroque music by local performers on early instruments, as well as a masterclass and an open house event, is a new collaboration between a number of local musicians and organizations with an interest in historical music performance, including the Early Music Society of Nova Scotia, the Halifax Institute of Traditional and Early Music, and Dalhousie University. Most events will be held in the beautiful and historic Round Church.

ADVENT STUDY: Meditating on Advent with Evelyn Underhill

This year we are offering a four-week study meant to prepare our hearts for Advent, using a book designed for just this purpose, "Music of Eternity: Meditations for Advent with Evelyn Underhill." We will meet for a brief discussion time on the four Sundays leading up to Christmas, immediately following Evening Prayer (and after Advent Lessons and Carols on December 10th), **starting on The Sunday Next Before Advent, November 26th.**

The book is divided into four Parts, with each Part subdivided into smaller sections for daily reading. We will read the designated Part on our own through the week and then meet on Sunday evenings for a discussion, with each week led by a different parishioner.
