

Total Budgeted Undesignated Offering for 2022: \$288,676.61 Budgeted undesignated offering as of the end of May: \$120,281.92 Total received as of the end of May: \$111,611.65

June Financial Update from the Treasurer

The parish ended May 2022 with a deficit of about \$21 000, having added an additional \$2600 more than first reported in the April statement (the expenses were incurred in April but the bills didn't arrive until sometime in May) and \$2500 in May. While not yet a problem, the trend is not in a happy direction. As we head into Trinity Season and the summer, I

Daily Offices have moved to the Little Dutch Church

The Daily Offices of Morning and Evening Prayer (Monday to Friday, 9 a.m. and 5:30 p.m.) and Evening Prayer on Sundays will be said in the Little Dutch Church, at the corner of Brunswick and Gerrish Streets until the end of September. Consecrated in 1761, the building dates from the 1750s (or perhaps earlier, and served as both the first Saint George's church before the Round Church was built in the early 1800s, and as the first location of St. George's Charitable School before the construction of the hall in the 1880's.

Update on Little Dutch Church Cemetery Wall Project and Request for Support

Preparations continue for the proposed work on the Gerrish Street wall, scheduled for this August. Another \$20,000 in grant funding has been received (\$10,000 from HRM and \$10,000 from our Councillor Smith's Capital District fund. We are now less than \$20,000 short of the \$240,000 of needed funds. Should any parishioners wish to contribute to the project, donations through the Parish will be gratefully accepted; donations should indicate that the monies are for the LDC wall project.

Rector's Study Leave and Vacation

Father Hatt will be away on one week of study leave followed by three weeks of vacation starting this Friday, July 1st and returning Friday, July 29th. Father Harris is on-call for pastoral emergencies and will be covering services during the Rector's absence.

Update - COVID Restrictions in the Church

Last month, Parish Council voted to remove the final COVID restrictions in the church, including the closing off of various pews. The greeters will no longer provide direction to the congregation at the time of Communion. The centre part of the Communion rail is to be reinstated, and we will no longer require only one family or individual per side of the Communion rail. The Rector and wardens were also directed to write a letter to Bishop Fyfe expressing the parish's desire to have the use of the Common Cup return.

Third Sunday after Trinity

Excerpt from Common Prayer Volume 4: Trinity Sunday to the Twelfth Sunday after Trinity.

O Lord, we beseech thee mercifully to hear us; and grant that we, to whom thou hast given an hearty desire to pray, may by thy mighty aid be defended and comforted in all dangers and adversities; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

We begin today's Collect by begging God to hear us and throwing ourselves on God's mercy: "O Lord, we beseech thee mercifully to hear us." But even this prayer that God would mercifully hear us is not our prayer. We did not initiate this prayer, but it is God himself through his Spirit, who gives us the desire to pray. As we reflect upon this, we are less tempted to condemn others for their seeming unfaithfulness for we realize that "there, but for the grace of God, go I". Prayer begins and ends with God—our role is to be a willing servant who desires God to use us to his glory. St. Augustine, speaking of the centrality of Jesus Christ in all prayer, said: "Christ prays for us as a priest, prays in us as our Head, is prayed to, by us, as our God. Let us recognize, therefore, our voices in him, and his voices in us." Our petition is that we "may by thy mighty aid be defended and comforted in all dangers and adversities". Note that we pray not that God shall keep us from danger, but keep us in our dangers and adversities. Whatever ills and evils may befall us, we know that God can make good come of any situation, if we offer it to him. This is the meaning of Psalm 9: "There shall no evil happen unto thee, neither shall any plague come nigh thy dwelling. For he shall give his angels charge over thee, to keep thee in all thy ways." Bishop Lancelot Andrewes (1555-1626) points out how the experience of the comfort of God serves to strengthen us to better withstand our "dangers and adversities": "Comfort is it by which, in the midst of our sorrows, we are comforted, that is, strengthened, and made the better able to bear them all out."

The Epistle for today reminds us that a holy life is only possible through grace, and that grace only comes to the humble (those who know their own weakness, and trust in Christ) and to those who do not give up the effort to resist temptation.

The Gospel for today is two parables, which together form a lesson on grace. God's grace is ready to pour into each one of us, however lowly and outcast, however far from God we may be. God is always ready to save us and sanctify us with his grace, regardless of how sinful we may be and how long we may take to open up to him.
