Worship during the Pandemic

The ongoing COVID-19 pandemic means that we must take extra precautions to help prevent the further spread of the virus. While in the church, please ...

- wear a mask;
- clean your hands upon arriving;
- check in with the greeter to record your name;
- do not sit in the pews marked off with a ribbon;
- refrain from shaking hands and try to cough or sneeze into your elbow.

At the time of the Holy Communion (during the 10:30 a.m. service only), please remain seated until the greeter has signaled that it is time for you to go. Those sitting around the outside aisles and the upstairs Gallery will go first, followed by those sitting around the centre aisle.

There are two stations for receiving the Sacrament, one on each side of the Communion rail. We ask that only one person or household go to each station at a time.

Upon leaving the Communion rail, follow the arrows back down the central aisle of the chancel.

At the end of the service, please exit the church using the door to the parking lot (side door to your right), or the Brunswick Street doors, leaving your prayer books in the box provided at the door. If physically possible, please consider using the Brunswick Street door, especially if you are seated near the back of the church.

At all times, we must observe physical distancing in the church, keeping six feet or two metres from those outside of your family or household. **It is tempting to chat with friends and newcomers at the back of the church at the end of the service, but it is best for people to gather for such conversations outdoors where distancing is easier.**

If you have travelled or have been in direct contact with someone who has travelled outside of Nova Scotia within the last fourteen days or are feeling unwell and have symptoms of COVID-19, please do not come to church. Let the Rector know if you are unwell so we can offer our care and our prayers for you.

Increase in public gathering numbers!

There is some good news which many of you will already have heard! New public health regulations for Phase 2 of the Provincial Reopening Plan now allow for faith gatherings of up to 25% of the venue's capacity up to 50 people indoors or 75 people outdoors with [social distancing](#). Beginning on Wednesday, June 16th, we resumed holding services in the Round Church according to our regular service schedule (**8 a.m. and 10:30 a.m. on Sunday and 10 a.m. on Wednesday**). This will continue until public health allows us to increase our numbers. **If you would like to attend the 10:30 Sunday morning service, please email Jordan in the parish office to reserve a space (office@roundchurch.ca).** For the Sunday 8 a.m. service and the Wednesday 10 a.m. service, just feel free to come along. Contact tracing will resume at all of these services, so be sure to check in with a greeter when you arrive.

Soup Kitchen Update

Our Saturday Soup Kitchen has been operating as a take-out only service since the start of the pandemic. We thank all those who have continued to volunteer, and the parishes and organizations who partner with us to offer hot meals on Saturdays for residents of the inner-city.

Last Week, June 19th: Team 1 led by Jim Rawding. Food and Volunteers came from St. Thomas' Fall River. 118 were served.

Yesterday, June 26th: Team 2 led by Mary Hills. Food came from St. George's.

Next Week, July 3rd: Team 3 led by Jordan Gracie. Food and volunteers will come from St. Francis by the Lakes

Parish Office during Lockdown
