



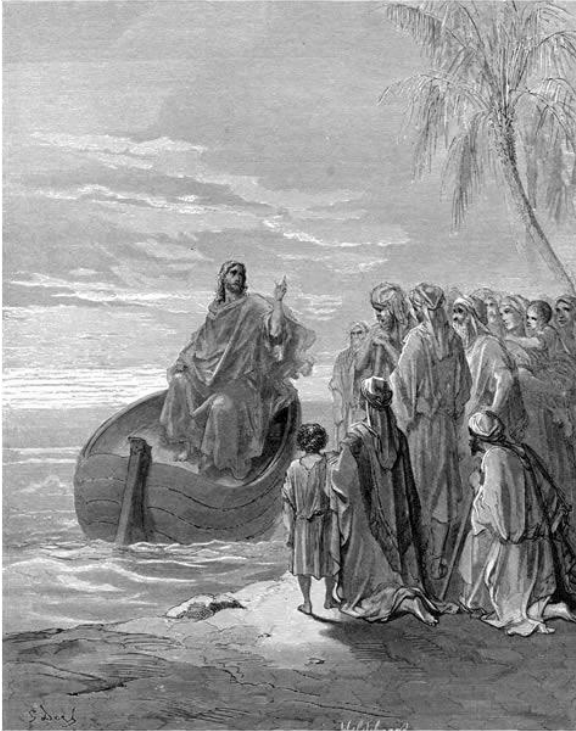

June Financial Update from the Treasurer

The parish ended May 2022 with a deficit of about \$21 000, having added an additional \$2600 more than first reported in the April statement (the expenses were incurred in April but the bills didn't arrive until sometime in May) and \$2500 in May. While not yet a problem, the trend is not in a happy direction. As we head into Trinity Season and the summer, I would ask the following:

- 1) For those able, please make a small additional donation to undesignated funds to knock down the deficit; and
- 2) For those not using an automatic giving mechanism (e.g. direct deposit, Canada Helps), please set a reminder, mark your calendar, or otherwise remember the parish through the summer months. There is an historic and very regular trend to have monthly giving drop off in the summer.

Daily Offices have moved to the Little Dutch Church

The Daily Offices of Morning and Evening Prayer (Monday to Friday, 9 a.m. and 5:30 p.m.) and Evening Prayer on Sundays will be said in the Little Dutch Church, at the corner of Brunswick and Gerrish Streets until the end of September. Consecrated in 1761, the building dates from the 1750s (or perhaps earlier, and served as both the first Saint George's church before the Round Church was built in the early 1800s, and as the first location of St. George's Charitable School before the construction of the hall in the 1880's.

Update on Little Dutch Church Cemetery Wall Project and Request for Support

Preparations continue for the proposed work on the Gerrish Street wall, scheduled for this August. Another \$20,000 in grant funding has been received (\$10,000 from HRM and \$10,000 from our Councillor Smith's Capital District fund. We are now less than \$20,000 short of the \$240,000 of needed funds. Should any parishioners wish to contribute to the project, donations through the Parish will be gratefully accepted; donations should indicate that the monies are for the LDC wall project.

Update - COVID Restrictions in the Church

Last month, Parish Council voted to remove the final COVID restrictions in the church, including the closing off of various pews. The greeters will no longer provide direction to the congregation at the time of Communion. The centre part of the Communion rail is to be reinstated, and we will no longer require only one family or individual per side of the Communion rail. The Rector and wardens were also directed to write a letter to Bishop Fyfe expressing the parish's desire to have the use of the Common Cup return.

PWRDF Support for Ukraine

The Primate's World Relief and Development Fund (PWRDF) is providing financial support to local aid agencies in Ukraine to help those forced to flee their homes (now thought to be more than 1 million people) due to the Russian invasion. Fifth Sunday after Trinity

excerpt from *COMMON PRAYER Volume 4: Trinity Sunday to the Twelfth Sunday After Trinity*

Grant, O Lord, we beseech thee, that the course of this world may be so peaceably ordered by thy governance, that thy Church may joyfully serve thee in all godly quietness; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

In today's Collect we pray for the peace of the world in order that the Church may joyfully serve God. This same theme is echoed elsewhere in our Prayer Book. In the Collect for the Queen (p. 70, Book of Common Prayer) the reason we pray for her well-being and our obedience to her is made clear, namely that we may "faithfully serve, honour, and humbly obey her, in thee, and for thee, according to thy blessed Word and ordinance." In the Intercession (p. 75, Book of Common Prayer), we pray that all nations may enjoy the blessings of freedom and peace, "to the maintenance of thy true religion and virtue." Such prayers are in accordance with St. Paul's advice in his first letter to Timothy, where he prompts prayers for kings and all in authority, in order that: "...we may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and honesty" (I Tim. 2. 2).

This Collect was composed in a time of war and unrest when it seemed that the Roman Empire was to be devastated by the Goths, Huns and Vandals. What hope could there be for the safety and continuance of the Church if such devastation took place? Our Gospel reading answers this question. Simon had fished all night but caught nothing. The troubled sea offered Simon no indication of prosperity or success, but Simon had faith in Christ: "...nevertheless at thy word I will let down the net." The sea brought forth bounty beyond measure. The Collect begs God's presence and peace so that the waves of this troublesome world may be stilled and the Ark of the Church serve him by gathering souls into her nets in all godly quietness. Finally, even if the rulers and governors of nations turn away from God to seek war and destruction, no true harm can actually be done to the Church. We pray for peace, but the Church does not depend upon world peace for her safety or existence. The Epistle brings us this message: "And who is he that will harm you, if ye be followers of that which is good? But and if ye suffer for righteousness' sake, happy are ye, and be not afraid of their terror, neither be troubled; but sanctify Christ as Lord in your hearts...."
