Worship during the Pandemic

The ongoing COVID-19 pandemic means that we must take extra precautions to care for our neighbour and help prevent the further spread of the virus. While in the church, please...

- clean your hands upon arriving in the church (hand sanitizer is available at the door)
- check-in with the greeter and make sure your name is recorded (this is required in the event that health authorities need to conduct contact tracing)
- refrain from sitting in the pews marked off with a ribbon
- refrain from shaking others' hands
- cough or sneeze into your elbow
- at the time of Communion during the 10:30 a.m. service, we ask that members of the congregation remain in their pews until the greeter or sidesperson has indicated that it is time for them to go forward. This is necessary to ensure we maintain proper physical distancing while in line to receive the Sacrament, now that there are larger numbers of people attending.
- exit the church using the vestry door (side door to your left) and drop your prayer book in the box at the door.

At all times, please observe physical distancing in the church, keeping six feet or two metres from those outside of your family or household. This is especially important when arriving or leaving the church and when approaching the altar to receive the Holy Communion. We encourage you to wear a mask. They are available from the greeter upon request. If you have travelled or have been in direct contact with someone who has travelled outside of Nova Scotia or the Atlantic 'bubble' within the last fourteen days, or are feeling unwell and have symptoms of COVID-19 please do not come to church. Let the Rector know if you are unwell so we can offer our care and our prayers for you!

Financial Update

Financial Update from the Finance Warden

Last month we reported that the parish had accumulated a small financial surplus. This was largely due to allotment relief from the Diocese and a subsidy of the Rector's stipend and housing allowance obtained by the Diocese through the federal government. We are very grateful that parishioners have continued to provide regular offerings to the parish which has put us in a strong financial position.

As of the end of June, that surplus has slightly increased to approximately \$25,000. While this is encouraging, we must now begin paying allotment expenses again and the subsidy for the Rector's stipend and housing could end at any time. We also have some additional expenses for cleaning the church and hall, the video recordings of our Sunday liturgy, and some minor property repairs. We also know that we will soon need to re-shingle the roof of the Round Church and paint the upper drum and cupola of the church which will be significant expenses. If we can maintain our current momentum, we will be in a good position to meet these challenges.

Thank you to all who have supported our parish so faithfully in recent months. We encourage everyone to continue their regular giving to the parish.

Property Update

Furnace replacement

You may have noticed the construction on Cornwallis Street and the south lawn of the Round Church earlier this week. Heritage gas was extending the gas line to the side of the church. The wall on Cornwallis was dismantled and the pavement cut through, these are being restored along with the lawn.

The old furnace and oil tanks were successfully removed and we now await the installation of the new boilers. Bremner's expects these to arrive this coming week, so full installation may well be completed by the end of the month. We shall be very relieved to enter the upcoming heating system without the worry of furnace breakdown. Many thanks to those who made this possible.

Exterior work on the Round Church

As most are aware, it is 25 years since the devastating fire and the subsequent rebuilding of the upper dome and cupola. The wooden shingles remain in good condition but need repainting. The roof shingles have deteriorated and need replacing; this will be done using the heaviest, longest lasting shingles. The painting of the cupola and upper dome will start this week, to be completed early September.. The re-shingling of the two upper domed roofs will then follow. Access to these work areas will require the use of staging and boom trucks which will, by times, block the Cornwallis Street entrance to the parking lot; best to access from Maynard Street.
