#### **Soup Kitchen: Call for Volunteers**

We are excited to announce that this September our soup kitchen, which runs every Saturday from the church hall, will be returning to dine-in service after over three years of offering only take away meals due to COVID. To help make this happen, we are looking for more volunteers from within our parish. Ways you can help:

- Join one of our 6 food-service teams to help with set up, food service, and clean up. This is a 3–4-hour commitment once every 6 Saturdays. In this role you will be led by one of our Team Leaders.
- Help prepare food. Every week we serve up to 150 meals. With some coordination, a group of 5-10 can prepare the seven or so large dishes of food required without too much trouble.
- Serve as a team leader. Each of the 6 teams is led by two team leaders. Our ranks have dropped since COVID, but this summer we will be recruiting and training 5-6 new leaders. The team leaders' commitment is 4-5 hours once every 6 Saturdays. The leaders are responsible for opening the doors to the hall, starting the coffee, lighting the ovens, hosting the volunteers that join us from other parishes, and ensuring that all is put back to order once soup kitchen has finished.

# **Parish Financial Update**

#### Hello everyone,

You'll see at the top of this note a status update on our undesignated offerings for the year to date. At the end of April the undesignated offerings are lagging behind the budget by about \$22,300. This is a bit worrisome as we head into the summer months when we always fall behind budgeted offerings. While we did pass a somewhat 'aspirational' budget at the Annual Meeting in February, offerings are lower than they were at this point last year.

I'm sure that we are all noticing that many things in our lives (food, housing) are more expensive this year than they were a year ago and many households are reconsidering their own budgets. This is also true for parish expenses. While the overall parish bank balance is healthy, much of that money is set for designated purposes and we are getting very close to not being able to pay expenses that require general funds.

#### What are general offerings?

Offerings that are not given to specific ministries are identified as undesignated on our financial statements. These are the offerings that go to operational costs and are what keep the doors open and include things like salaries for our music director and parish administrator, stipend and housing for the Rector, heat, insurance, general maintenance for the buildings etc.

Offerings earmarked to support specific ministries such as Soup Kitchen, Music, YouthNet and others are the *designated offerings*. These ministries are part of our identity and help define our place in this neighbourhood. These offerings can only be used for their designated purpose.

#### How to make an offering to the parish:

- 1. The offering plate cash or cheque. At the 8am Sunday service you can place your offering in the plate at the back of the church across from the table where you pick up your prayer book and bulletin. At the 1030 service, you can place your offering in the plate as it passes during the offertory hymn. If you don't have envelopes, you can use one of the guest envelopes in the book racks in the pews, or ask one of the greeters for a guest envelope. Cheques can be made out to "Parish of St George". If you would like envelopes, please contact the envelope secretary, Judith Fisher (judithellenfisher@gmail.com), Parish Office (office@roundchurch.ca) or the Treasurer (treasurer@roundchurch.ca)
- **2. Direct Debit:** There are forms available at the back of the church again by the prayer books to sign up for monthly direct debit. Please return the form to the parish office. Direct debits are processed on the 28<sup>th</sup> of the month. The Treasurer can make changes to your direct debit amounts up to the 26<sup>th</sup> of each month. She does need this recorded via an updated, signed direct debit form.
- **3. E-transfer:** The parish accepts e-transfers to <u>treasurer@roundchurch.ca</u>. The parish is set up for automatic deposit no password required. The Treasurer tracks e-transfers weekly and reports them to the parish office and envelope secretary at the end of each month.
- **4. Canada Helps:** The parish is on Canada Helps! < <a href="https://www.canadahelps.org/en/charities/parish-of-st-george/">https://www.canadahelps.org/en/charities/parish-of-st-george/</a>>. Through them, we can receive offerings via credit card.

Please note that Canada Helps does retain a small percentage of the transaction to maintain their service to charities.

As we move into the summer months when offerings tend to drop off, please remember your parish. While you may be supporting parishes on your travels, as you can see below, you don't have to be in Halifax to make a contribution to St George's.

I can be reached through treasurer@roundchurch.com. I'm available to chat most Sundays after the 8am service and plan to attend the 1030 service on June 4<sup>th</sup>. The wardens, Kieva, Tracy and Matthew are regularly at the 1030 service and take questions and pass them along to me.

The liturgy of the Book of Common Prayer Holy Communion service reminds us weekly that "All things come of Thee, and of Thine own have we given Thee". What we have isn't really ours - in our offerings we are returning those gifts to the One who bestowed them on us.
